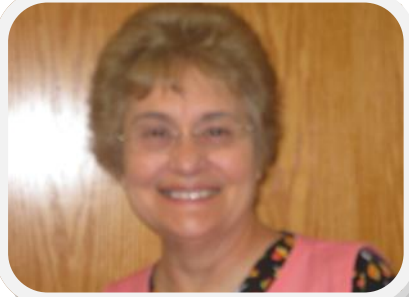

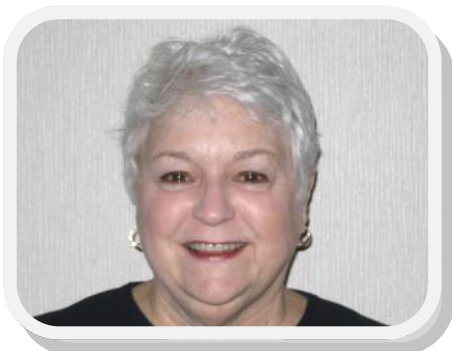

The Joint Commission Survey of the WakeMed Cary Hospital Primary Stroke Program Ends with Recommendation for Recertification

The Joint Commission Surveyor Elizabeth Kim, MSN, APN-CNS, completed her one-day survey at WakeMed Cary Hospital. She was pleased to announce that she is recommending WakeMed Cary Hospital for another two-year recertification in primary stroke care.

The surveyor had positive things to say about our staff, policies and practices throughout her entire day with us. At the opening presentation, she noted that she appreciated the way different departments presented their key information. She did have one requirement for improvement (formerly known as a finding) and staff are already working on an appropriate action plan. Ms. Kim explained that the Primary Stroke Center standards were "heavily revised" recently and noted that several programs in the United States have had up to six requirements for improvement. "Yours is a really exceptional report, especially with the revised standards," she said. Ms. Kim closed with the fact that "We have an awesome team and an awesome program."

"My thanks to everyone at Cary Hospital and throughout the entire WakeMed system for yet another successful Joint Commission reaccreditation survey," said David Coulter, senior vice president & administrator, WakeMed Cary Hospital. "Your dedication to ensuring stroke patients receive timely, appropriate care and collaborating with patients, families and your colleagues to achieve the best possible outcomes are the reasons why The Joint Commission continues to recognize us."

WakeMed Partners with Baby+Company for New Stand-Alone Maternity Centers

WakeMed is pleased to announce a new partnership with Baby+Company in the development of a stand-alone maternity center on Ashville Avenue in Cary. While Baby+Company is new to this market, they are well established elsewhere and have significant experience with offering women an option for labor and delivery utilizing certified nurse midwives. Freestanding birthing centers are the fastest growing segment in maternity care nationwide, and while the number of women interested in an out-of-hospital birthing experience is still small, it too is growing.

When it opens in October, the Cary Baby+Company will be Wake County's only free-standing birthing center. Plans are underway for additional sites in this area. Once in full operation, the Cary center is expected to accommodate approximately 380 deliveries annually.

Baby+Company's staff of certified nurse midwives offer high-touch pre-conception, pre-natal, labor and delivery, postpartum and newborn care, and educational support. Medical direction will be provided by Lisa Grana, MD, of Triangle Physicians for Women. Birthing mothers will have the added security of being near Cary Hospital should the need for a higher level of care be required.

"Recognizing that women and their families want access to a wide range of quality birthing options, WakeMed looks forward to working closely with Baby+Company as they build a presence in this area," commented Donald Gintzig, president and CEO. "As you know, building partnerships is a key element in our new strategic plan. As Wake County's leader in women's health, this partnership provides a great opportunity for WakeMed to ensure that mothers-to-be who are interested in a birthing experience at a freestanding center receive high quality care. Baby+Company was already coming to this market and the value of WakeMed as a health system partner made sense as we continue to meet the needs of all families."

Providing women with low-risk pregnancies access to this out-of-hospital alternative complements the extensive birthing options currently offered by WakeMed Raleigh Campus, Cary Hospital and soon North Hospital. "Delivery inside a hospital with access to neonatal services is always the safest option for mother and baby; however, women with select low-risk pregnancies deserve a safe alternative to traditional in-hospital delivery," added James Perciaccante, MD, director, WakeMed Physician Practices – Neonatology. "We are pleased that Baby+Company and WakeMed have chosen to partner to make this the safest endeavor possible, and we are happy to offer our neonatal expertise."

Dr. Lisa Grana, OB/GYN with Triangle Physicians for Women in Cary and medical director for Baby+Company adds, "By working closely with Triangle Physicians for Women and WakeMed, Baby+Company gives women the added security of a leading physician group and a hospital should the need arise."

Baby+Company is located at 226 Ashville Avenue in Cary. The center will accept all major insurance plans.

WakeMed, Vidant Health and Wake Forest Baptist Collaborate to Form New Company

Will share services, best practices while retaining independent structure, governance and identity

WakeMed is pleased to announce the formation of a new shared services company designed to improve health care quality and affordability for patients across the state. WakeMed is collaborating with Vidant Health and Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center to create a member-based company that will allow each organization to benefit from their combined scale, scope and shared knowledge while maintaining full independence and identity.

The new non-profit company, to be named later, will have its own governance structure and executive leadership, with approximately four to seven employees initially. Its formation is not a step toward merger or acquisition.

This unique opportunity is possible because the three member systems share similar missions, visions, values and strategic focus. Leaders from all three systems see the value of partnering with like-minded health care organizations in providing enhanced access and the best quality, affordable health care to patients. "This collaborative fits perfectly with our mission and goals of seeking preferred partners to deliver an exceptional level of health care service while leveraging our structures and technological resources," said Donald Gintzig, president & CEO. "We want to deliver the best value to patients and do so in a cost-effective manner that is beneficial for all."

The company will initially focus on establishing traditional business-to-business shared services such as supply chain management, group purchasing and information services/technology management to reduce costs. The three organizations are currently evaluating the types of shared services that will deliver the greatest value..

The alignment of resources through this company allows the members to leverage the collective experience and talents of all three systems to innovate and create business and clinical efficiencies. Importantly, the alliance also will help each member organization advance health care reform initiatives such as Accountable Care Organization development and implementation, care coordination and population health management.

In today's new world of health care, WakeMed firmly believes that success will come through effective partnerships of organizations with kindred missions and values. WakeMed has a strong history of partnering with other organizations to help improve the health of our community and this new collaboration will not impact our existing partnerships, which include UNC – Chapel Hill, our primary partner for training physicians for over 40 years; clinical services partnerships with Duke Medicine; and numerous other partnerships around health, including the YMCA of the Triangle, Alliance Medical Ministries, and others. CARF Survey: WakeMed Rehab Is Recommendation-free through Two Surveys

Only two percent of CARF International-affiliated organizations in the world enjoy recommendation-free surveys. WakeMed Rehabilitation has done it twice in a row. Today, the four CARF surveyors who have been in the Rehabilitation Hospital since Thursday morning gave glowing compliments to our policies, our procedures and, mostly, our staff for the high-quality care and service they provide to patients and families.

WakeMed's accreditation includes the Rehabilitation Hospital for general rehabilitation and specialty programming in stroke, spinal cord injury care and brain injury rehabilitation, as well as a specialty spinal cord and brain injury day treatment program. WakeMed has maintained CARF accreditation since 1993.

This accreditation is the highest level awarded and demonstrates our commitment to programs and services that are measurable, accountable and of the highest quality. "We expected a great survey result because of the scope of services we offer and positive patient outcomes we deliver, but a recommendation-free survey for the second time in a row is beyond expectation," commented Beth Rudisill, director, Rehabilitation Hospital. "We have an amazing team and it shows. I thank everyone for their hard work and commitment." Surveyors recognized Rehab's staff for their professionalism, the pride they take in their work and their cohesive commitment to care delivery.

WakeMed Rehab will receive the final report and official word about reaccreditation from CARF in approximately eight weeks.

FY14 Annual Report

Over the past year, The *Volunteers* have contributed their time, talents and financial support to augment the services offered by the hospital system, and to help provide a caring environment for our patients and families.

These contributions include:

Volunteer Service Hours and Value

In Fiscal Year 2014 1,383 active volunteers worked more than 124,665.50 hours.

Adult Programs	63,043.75 hours
Junior Volunteers	6,879.00 hours
Sewing Individuals/groups	54,502.75 hours
Kidworks	240.00 hours

The 1,383 volunteers participating this year included:

Adult In-House	707
College Students	113
Junior Volunteers	181
Sewing Individual/groups	380
Kidworks	2

These volunteers represent the equivalent of an average of 61 full time employees each month.

There are a total of 214 volunteer placements supporting 171 departments across the hospital system. This number includes placements within Raleigh Campus and Cary Hospital, but also at other WakeMed facilities, including WakeMed North Healthplex, WakeMed Brier Creek Healthplex, WakeMed Apex Healthplex, WakeMed Garner Healthplex, Clayton Medical Park, Raleigh Medical Park, WakeMed Physician Practice offices at Fuquay, Garner and Apex, WakeMed Business Center, WakeMed Corporate Center, Rehab Services at Kraft Family YMCA and Alexander YMCA.

Fundraising Activities

The *Volunteers* promote a number of special fundraising events and manage other sources of income. These activities produced a total of \$73,473 in revenue for the organization over the past 12 months.

Annual Golf Outing

The largest fundraiser managed by *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital* each year is an annual charity golf outing. On October 21, 2013 the 15th annual golf outing was held at MacGregor Downs Country Club with 75 golfers participating. Susan Alvey, chairperson, and a hardworking committee of volunteers raised over \$12,376.89 with support from golfers, hole sponsors, major sponsorships and the sale of raffle tickets and mulligans.

Blossoms for Life.

This is a year-round giving and fundraising program that provides an opportunity to honor or memorialize a friend or family member through a donation to *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital*. Pam Ayars chaired Blossoms this year, and the ongoing campaign raised \$1,942 from October 2013 to mid-September 2014.

Vendor Sales

The *Volunteers* hosted 10 vendor sales (uniforms, jewelry, accessories and shoes) this past fiscal year and raised a total of \$36,428.

Additional Revenue Sources:

Infant Photo Contract

Working with Charlie's Angels, The *Volunteers* received \$13,865 from sales of baby photos to new parents and grandparents.

Uniform On-Line Sales

Working with 1st Uniform, Inc, The *Volunteers* received \$8,287 from sales of uniforms to WakeMed employees thru online sales.

WakeMed Gives

From the annual campaign The *Volunteers* received \$926 from employees to support Healthy Lifestyles and other programs.

Special Projects and Donations:

Funds from annual fundraising events, donations and other revenue sources allow the *Volunteers* to support a number of important initiatives across the hospital system. Efforts for FY 2014 included:

Baby Packet Supplies: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus* provided \$2,733 for the purchase of onesies, diapers, bottles, blankets, etc. so that the Case Managers on 4B can give immediate needs new moms some newborn gifts/supplies at discharge.

Children Activity Packets: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital* provided \$1,138 to create children diversionary activity packets for children who are in the hospital for extended periods of time visiting, waiting in the waiting rooms or with parents and family.

Congestive Heart Failure (CHF) Scales: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh* provided \$924 for 30 sets of scales given to low-income heart failure patients that provide a way to identify increased signs of increased fluid retention, a sign of heart failure, for better management of CHF on an out-patient basis and to reduce hospital readmission for CHF.

Huggables/Memory Quilts/Hats – *The Volunteers* provided \$4,710 towards the purchasing of supplies to support the efforts of sewing individuals/groups to make handmade huggables, lap robes, stuffed animals, shawls, pillows, bed bags, toys, dolls, adult bibs, hats, preemie booties, preemie caps, baby gowns, bereavement blankets and more to be distributed to patients and families. These gifts are distributed via the Friendly Face Cart, volunteers and by staff to patients.

Healthy Lifestyles - Cardiac Rehab Scholarships: The *Volunteers* provided \$4,570 in scholarship funds to cardiac patients. These individuals have been identified by Health Works staff as qualifying for financial support and who otherwise would not be able to complete a key part of the recovery from a cardiac episode. The classes include education about nutrition and exercise, participating in exercise classes and more.

Magazine Subscriptions: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus* provided \$900 for subscriptions of Spanish and African American magazines to be shared with patients. The magazines are distributed by volunteers through the Friendly Face Cart service.

Parents Time Together: The *Volunteers* provided \$1,927 in funds to provide time, place and meals for parents of infants in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Parents Time Together allows time to support each other by sharing common experience and a time for educational events.

Rainbow Fund - *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital* provided \$7,000 to provide medications to immediate-need children and adults who were not in a position to pay for their initial prescriptions. \$727 was donated by The WakeMed Foundation and \$1,700 was donated by the Raleigh Medical Group.

Reach Out and Read (ROR): *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus* provided \$2,348 for the purchase of new books to be distributed to well-visit patients ages 6 months to 5 years who are seen in the WakeMed Physician Practice Pediatric Clinic. This national literacy program has been the recipient of grants from National ROR based upon community support and distribution of books.

Special Infant Care Clinic: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus* provided \$505 for the purchase of infant car seats, supplies, transportation vouchers and medication for infants and their families when no other monetary resource is available.

FY14 Annual Report continued

Spinal Cord Injury Program: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus* provided \$2,941 to improve care delivery and clinical outcomes of patients admitted with new onset, traumatic spinal cord injury. The goals are to increase self-care independence and prevent complications.

Tea for the Soul: *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital* provided \$126 for Spiritual Care Services to offer refreshments in a quiet, calming locations for all caregivers to take a break.

WakeMed Foundation (Society of 1961) - A membership donation in support of the Society of 1961. *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital* contributed \$2,500. *The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus* contributed \$5,000.

WakeMed Foundation – *The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital* contributed \$5,575 towards their \$31,000 pledge to the WakeMed Cary Hospital restricted fund. This pledge supports future initiative for expansion, programs or services at WakeMed Cary Hospital.

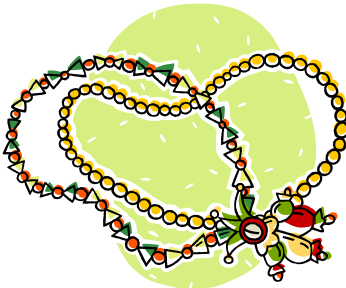
