Hello Everyone!

The WakeMed Cary Volunteer Board of Directors welcomes four new Board members as we look forward to a new year with exciting new possibilities. Joining our Board are hospital volunteers Sharon Thomas, Garry Miller, Jennifer Clark and Nisha Padia.

Once again the Cary Board will host Trunk and Treat on Friday, October 28 from 5:30 to 8:00 PM. This has been the "labor of love" for outgoing Board member Lois Dziedzic, who recently relocated from the Cary area and will no longer volunteer at the hospital. Under her leadership, this event has grown annually to a premier Town of Cary event.

The 2022 event on in the WakeMed Cary Hospital parking lot will feature decorated car "trunks" and costumed adult characters handing out treats provided by the Volunteers and Sponsors. Trunk and Treat provides a quality family event highlighting WakeMed Cary as the Town of Cary's "hometown" medical facility.

In 2021, an estimated 1000 treaters visited 20 decorated vehicles provided by hospital departments and neighboring businesses. In addition, both the Cary Police and Fire Department were represented with vehicles and personnel. They all came out in force on a cold and rainy night!

This event provides the children of Cary a safe "trick or treat" experience and all Cary (and neighboring community) children are invited free of charge. It is also an opportunity for local businesses to support WakeMed Cary in a very visible manner, and for hospital personnel to participate in a fun community event. Finally, it is an opportunity for WakeMed Cary to present ourselves to our Cary Community in a fun way.

The entire Volunteer Board helped solicit sponsors who generously provided funding to support the event including: Chicken Salad Chick, DiProfio Homes, J&F Gemelli Hair Salon, Johnson Hyundai of Wake Forest, New York Life Insurance of Raleigh, Reys Steakhouse, Steve Palmer, The Templeton of Cary, Thomas Guertin Real Estate and Tobacco Road Sports Café.

This year, the Volunteer Board anticipate the participation of approximately 25 vehicles, and to serve potentially 1200 children. In addition to the decorated vehicles, police car and fire truck, a disc jockey will provide entertainment to create a festive atmosphere.

Theresa is able to help patients and visitors through very difficult and stressful experiences. She is able to help, listen, and make a connection to bring them comfort. When asked what her volunteer experience means to her, she answered "I love it here. Interacting with people and helping them directly is my passion and it brings me energy! I appreci-

ate that WakeMed has such a strong and diverse volunteer program so we can all help the people in and around Wake County."

Theresa makes a difference in the lives of our visitors and patients. There was a particular time she recalls when she was escorting a visitor to the ICU. "One lady talked to me all the way up to ICU about how she didn't want to see her friend in the hospital in the condition she was in but she knew God wanted her to. When she stopped and couldn't go into the room to see her friend, I reminded her what she had said to me on the way up. She went into the room and talked to her friend for the last time. I saw her when she was leaving the hospital and she thanked me."

Theresa brings her compassionate care to WakeMed and believes *Respect for People* is the WakeWay every-time behavior that best describes her. "I love that everything that we do has our patients and families at the top. Families are so important to the healing process. Sometimes people come to WakeMed and do not have a family to support them. In those cases, I work to be the support person for them so they know someone is there for them."

Sam Weitzel and Reima Bash are both Duke University students but are also big sisters to younger brothers. Now that they are in college, they are spending their Saturday evenings carpooling together to WakeMed Cary to volunteer in the Women's Pavilion. We asked them why they chose WakeMed to volunteer their time, and here is what they had to say.

Sam Weitzel: "One of the first memories I have regarding my brother, who's four years younger than me, was through WakeMed Cary. I took a class about how to be a big sister through the Women's Pavilion, learning how to hold a baby and be as gentle as a four-year old can be. I was also born at WakeMed Cary myself. I've grown up hearing stories of my mom's surgery and looking at the photos of her holding me for the first time. I jumped on the opportunity to volunteer in the Women's Pavilion now as a college student, hoping to also contribute to that incredible experience that WakeMed fosters for families, mothers, babies, and all groups it serves. Being involved in the effective yet gentle care that the entire WakeMed

community offers will allow me to learn some of the crucial elements of a compassionate healthcare provider. In the future, I see myself creating some of the same feelings of joy, love, and care through medicine. WakeMed is one of the primary places that I've seen these feelings growing up, and I wanted to help give that same experience to others that come through these doors."

Reima Bash: "When my brother was born, my father sat me down with obstetrics and gynecology pamphlets on the process of pregnancy. As he traced his fingers over the diagrams and explained the medical jargon in four-year old terms, I became engrossed with the idea of life and the mechanics behind it. At the hospital, I remember looking up both physically and literally to the people in the delivery room and women's health department. Similar to the cell, every single part of the department has to work in coordination together with the patient's care at the forethought.

Going to the hospital is stressful, no matter what the situation is and I always want to be the person to put others at ease and help them. Volunteering at WakeMed has helped me develop a further love and passion for women's health and medicine.
