Hospitality Pets

This year 27 teams averaged 314 visits to patients a month for a grand total of 4,711 visits. Pet/person teams have made more than 88,873 visits since the program started in 2000.

Huggables/Hats/Quilts

Our sewing volunteers contributed 74,517.25 hours to complete baby hats, huggables, and many other handmade items. Our volunteers and friends in the community have contributed many hours of love and care to knit, crochet, sew, quilt and stuff this year.

Volunteer Dollars: Working Hard for Our Mission

The 2017 Volunteer fundraising efforts yielded \$75,736. The Volunteers raised funds through vendor sales, online uniform sales, Blossoms for Life (honors/memorializes a loved one at Cary Hospital), WakeMed Gives (employee giving campaign) and infant photo contracts. The Volunteers used these dollars to support programs and initiatives for patients, families, WakeMed departments and employees.

Rehab Clothing Closet – The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$2,000 to Rehab to create a clothing closet for patients with limited means. The basiclevel clothing allows the patient to fully participate in their therapy program. Blossoms for Life – A special fundraising program developed by The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital raised \$1,650 to fund programs and services throughout the hospital. The fundraiser offers individuals the opportunity to honor or memorialize a friend or family member. It is a unique way to say thank you for care received, remember a loved one and celebrate a special life event.

Congestive Heart Failure Scales – The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$476 to the Heart Center for the purchase of scales for low-income heart failure patients.

Huggables/Memory Quilts/Hats – The Volunteers provided \$4,259 towards the purchasing of supplies to support the efforts of sewing individuals/groups to make handmade huggables, lap robes, stuffed animals, shawls, pillows, bed bags, toys, dolls, adult bibs, hats, preemie booties, preemie caps, baby gowns, bereavement blankets and more to be distributed to patients and families. These gifts are distributed to patients via the Friendly Face Cart, volunteers and staff.

Magazine Subscriptions – The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$507 for subscriptions of Spanish and African American magazines to be shared with patients. The magazines are distributed by volunteers through the Friendly Face Cart service.

Reach Out and Read – The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$3,917 for the purchase of new books to be distributed to well-visit patients ages 6 months to 5 years who are seen in WakeMed Physician Practices --Pediatrics. This literacy program has been the recipient of grants from National ROR based on community support and distribution of books.

Tea for the Soul – The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital provided \$157 for Spiritual Care Services to offer refreshments in quiet, calming locations for all caregivers to take a break.

Contributing to the Strategic Plan

As members of the WakeMed family, the work of the Volunteers is helping us achieve both our mission and vision of the community in several ways.

Innovation

Baby Packet Supplies: The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$2,800 for the purchase of onesies, diapers, bottles, blankets, etc. so that the Case Managers on 4B can give new moms with immediate needs some newborn gifts/supplies at discharge.

Wake Way

Children's Activity Packets: The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital provided \$205 to create diversionary activity packets for children who are in the hospital for extended periods of time visiting, waiting in the waiting rooms or with parents and family.

Healthy Community

Healthy Lifestyles: Cardiac Rehab Scholarships: The Volunteers provided \$3,623 in scholarship funds to cardiac patients. These individuals were identified by Health Works staff as qualifying for financial support and who otherwise would not be able to complete a key part of the recovery from a cardiac episode. The classes include education about nutrition and exercise, participating in exercise classes and more.

Rainbow Fund: The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital provided \$5,000 to provide medications to immediate-need children and adults who were not in a position to pay for their initial prescriptions.

Innovation

Mr. Potato Head Program: The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$800 in funds to provide Mr. Potato Heads to NICU low birth weight newborn babies. The Mr. Potato Head provides a germ-free way for parents to measure the growth of their newborn baby while in the NICU. **Highest Ethics**

Parents Time Together: The Volunteers provided \$2,387 in funds to provide time, a place and meals for parents of infants in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Parents Time Together gives parents time and a place to support each other by sharing common experiences and participating in educational events.

Culture of Safety

Special Infant Care Clinic: The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$414 for the purchase of infant car seats, supplies, transportation vouchers and medication for infants and their families.

Extraordinary Team

Professional Membership Dues for Volunteer Staff: The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus provided \$1,184 and The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital provided \$969 to support the Volunteer Services Department staff. This allows the staff to continue to be leaders and gain great knowledge in the Volunteer industry.

Financial Health

WakeMed Foundation: The Volunteers at WakeMed Cary Hospital contributed \$13,000 towards Women's Pavilion lobby furniture as part of the area's renovation project. The Volunteers at WakeMed Raleigh Campus contributed \$10,000 towards their \$30,000 pledge to the renovation of the Labor & Deliver rooms at WakeMed Raleigh Campus.

Mending Hearts Out of Tragedy


On September 27, 2016, Joe Rizkallah and the Michael & Son Services' family lost one of their most respected plumbers in Raleigh, Joe Lomax Jr., to a cardiac arrest while at a jobsite. To honor this special employee and educate others about heart health, Joe reached out to an organization that knows well too much about cardiac events, Mended Hearts of the Triangle Chapter 394, asking them to partner in their annual golf tournament.

As a result, the event was renamed the 2017 Joe Lomax Classic Golf Tournament Charity and was held on June 19 at Devils Ridge Golf Course in Holly Springs. Players enjoyed the game and food from participating sponsors: Chick-fil-a, City Barbecue, and Brüeprint Brewing Company. Joe Lomax, Jr.'s family was able to enjoy this special event, and this tournament raised over \$21,000 for the Mended Hearts of the Triangle Chapter 394.




