Trauma Bravo: Trauma team member eval

Fall - Adult >20ft; Child >10 ft or 3x height

Fall - Adult >65 fall from any height if anticoagulated with GCS <13

MVC - Intrusion of 12" driver compartment, Intrusion of 18" any compartment

Ejection from auto (partial or complete)

Death in same passenger compartment

Auto vs Pedestrian/cyclist thrown, run over, or with

significant (>20mph) impact Motorcycle crash >20 mph

Abdominal trauma with firm or distended abdomen or seatbelt sign

Blunt chest trauma

Significant burns (>10% or to the hands, feet or perineum OR

potential for airway compromise) Altered mental status (GCS >8) after significant injury

OB Trauma Alpha Criteria >/=20 weeks:

Meeting Trauma Alpha criteria OR the following with traumatic injury: Vaginal bleeding Significant Blunt Mechanism Altered mental status (GCS 9-<14) after trauma or significant injury Pelvic fracture 1 long bone fracture Ejection (Partial/complete) from auto Fall >20 feet Auto vs Pedestrian/cyclist thrown, run over, or with >20mph impact Burns with potential for airway compromise Anticoagulant/antiplatelet/anti-thrombin agents Fetal heart rate of <110 bpm for greater than 60 seconds Provider discretion

OB Trauma Bravo Criteria >/=20 weeks:

Meets the following with traumatic injury:

Abdominal pain

Blunt chest trauma

MVC - Intrusion of 12" driver compartment, Intrusion of 18" any compartment

Death in same passenger compartment

Motorcycle crash >20 mph

Blunt thoracic/abdominal trauma with firm or distended abdomen or seatbelt sign

Significant burns (>10% or to the hands, feet or perineum)

Provider discretion

*Injuries occurring within 24 hrs should be considered for activation

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
