- Dose 1: Saturday, July 31 (8 am to 2 pm) & Sunday, August 1 (2 to 5 pm)
- Dose 2: Saturday, August 21 (8 am to 2pm) & Sunday, August 2 (2 to 5 pm)

Our most exciting news is that all current volunteers will be returning to inhouse placements and the application portal for new in-house volunteers will open on August 2! Your board continues to pursue this year's goals with focus on our community volunteers and distribution of handmade comfort items, planning for our October 29 Trunk or Treat (save the date and help us celebrate with our community), vendor sale fundraisers, and brainstorming on future fundraising activities.

Have you seen the recent WakeMed facebook posts about our community sewers? This is an awesome collection of groups and individuals. Our patients are so appreciative of the numerous shawls, wraps, animals, blankets, quilts, baby hats, and other handmade items donated to make their stay more comfortable. The portals for new sewing volunteers as well as a new painting volunteer program are currently open on the WakeMed website.

The Threads Committee continues to work on a Pop-Up Sale for Wednesday, December 1, to be held in the hallway outside Volunteer Services. One of a kind, handmade gift items are being selected for sale. Save the date and shop with us. All proceeds will be used to fund the purchase of supplies for our community sewers.

Recent vendor fundraisers including Retail Concepts (online April12-18) and Dillard's (pre-shop) May 25-31) netted \$1,236.23 and \$1,841.23, respectively, for volunteer funding of hospital needs. If you are aware of needs in your placement area, typically \$5,000 or less, please encourage the staff to apply for volunteer support. Our upcoming 1st Uniform Sale (July 23 – August 9) will be online.

The volunteer board Nominating Committee is soliciting nominations for potential FY22 board members. Board positions are 1- or 3-year terms that begin on October 1. The Material Girls has been busy making newborn quilts. This is a group that works well together as each person does a part of the quilt, like an assembly line! Rebecca Andrews and Cris Brookhart cut the fabric to put together the kits for a quilt. Kathy Ackerman sews pieces together. Becky Harbour then uses her long arm sewing machine which sews a beautiful pattern on the fabric. Finally, Sue Moore puts the binding around the quilts. Cris completes some quilts independently too. They probably made more quilts this year with everyone staying home. It was nice to be able to "see" each other, dropping off quilts for the next person. Just to say "hi" from six feet away!



This group started about twenty-two years ago. It was originally a book club for neighbors. Then they realized that a lot of them quilted. They have done other projects including work with Camp Kesem, which is for kids whose parents have cancer. They took the drawings the kids made and turned those into quilts!

Another way they have helped is through assembling kits for Days for Girls. DFG kits including items such as reusable pads, washcloth and soap are made for girls in over 100 countries. DFG advances menstrual equity, dignity, and opportunity for all.

The ladies were looking for another project a few

years ago, when they saw that WakeMed was looking for items for our patients. They decided to make us their next project, while they still work on Project Linus as well. *Thanks ladies, for all you do!*






- Interested individuals must be 14 years of age
