WAKEMED, SIEMENS HEALTHINEERS ANNOUNCE INNOVATIVE COLLABORATION

In September, WakeMed and Siemens Healthineers announced a new collaboration to create a patient-focused **Value Partnership**. The agreement will allow us to innovate care delivery over the next 10 years through the use of robotics, advanced 3D imaging technology, artificial intelligence and workforce training within WakeMed's existing cardiovascular intervention and imaging programs.

This relationship builds on the long-standing relationship between WakeMed and Siemens and will help improve patient outcomes. It will primarily impact the imaging and diagnostic tools across the system as well as those used by our cardiovascular intervention teams. As part of the agreement, WakeMed will become the first health system in the state to serve as a Siemens Healthineers **Value Partnership** hub site.

"WakeMed has been on the forefront of technology and innovation for nearly 60 years, and this collaboration with a worldwide leader in imaging, AI, education and research will help us build on that legacy. This relationship will contribute not only to our mission but also our Aspirational Goals related to healthy community, innovation, strong partnerships and, above all, providing safe, high-quality care," explains **Donald Gintzig**, WakeMed president & CEO. "In health care, it is the people who make the difference – and when we pair our incredible people with the most advanced technology and training, provided by Siemens Healthineers, the result is truly exceptional care."

As part of this effort, WakeMed will introduce new cardiovascular robotic and diagnostic capabilities as well as state-of-the-art imaging equipment, enhancing our ability to provide outstanding care to Wake County and surrounding areas. Examples of this work already underway include the new ARTIS Icono biplane at Raleigh Campus (pictured above), which will be available in early November, and a new PET CT scanner, which will be installed at the new Medical Park of Cary later this year.

Key aspects of this agreement include:

• Implementation of a world-class hybrid operating room, leveraging our Corindus CorePath GRX robot already in use and the addition of ARTIS Icono.

• Creation of a Corindus Training Academy, a workforce development program and training site for imaging and robotic intervention innovations.

• Combining advanced imaging technology with top-of-the-line equipment and precise robotic assistance to ensure the best possible

outcomes for patients and providers.Integration of artificial intelligence applications, enhancing our ability to identify disease earlier, reduce variance and participate in the development of new clinical approaches.

WakeMed's work with Siemens will continue to expand over time and will include additional innovations such as the use of remote technologies and other transformational initiatives and clinical capabilities.

Chasing Zero: Incident Tracking

THE MORE WE REPORT, THE MORE WE LEARN!

As our Chasing Zero journey continues, we are shifting our focus to Incident Tracking (IT). Sometimes called incident reporting or event reporting, incident tracking refers to the process of submitting patient safety events, errors, Good Catches and near misses for review and follow up. Incident Tracking is critical to our patient safety efforts because it helps us identify process issues that need to be fixed and opportunities to improve the care we provide.



At WakeMed, IT is:

- Critical to help us identify and correct potential risks
- Not intended to place blame or lead to discipline, except in cases of intentional or egregious conduct
- Required, per policy, within 24 hours of the incident or event taking place
- The responsibility of each employee, as part of our commitment to patient care!

After events are submitted, the appropriate leaders will review the situation to see if further evaluation and process changes are needed. Patient Safety and/or Risk Management will support department actions and identify trends for further investigation and improvement.

Making IT Easier

As part of this initiative, two changes were recently made to RL Solutions to help improve the user experience:

- Simplified Harm Score: Each RL Solutions form asks users to identify the "Event Severity at the Time of Submission." Previously, this drop down included nine different options and relied on a subjective assessment that may be inaccurate. The drop down was recently condensed to just three options.
- Automated Email Response: All submissions now receive an automated email to confirm the report was received. Additional emails are sent every time the file is updated or closed, so you can stay informed about any follow up that occurs after your submission.

New for this Year: Good Catch Goal!

As part of the Fiscal Year 2021 Strategic Plan Metrics, we are tracking the number of Good Catches that are submitted each month. The goal is to increase the percentages of Good Catch reporting.

Reporting Good Catches is important because they help us identify process improvement opportunities and implement changes to improve patient safety. WakeMed is committed to fostering a culture of safety where all members of the care team are encouraged to speak up to improve the care our patients receive. Submitting a Good Catch is one way you can do this!

Key Terms to Know

- **RL Solutions** is a confidential event reporting system that allows employees and physicians to submit incidents and events for review and follow up.
- A **Good Catch** is a potentially negative event or circumstance that's caught or corrected *before* it ever reaches a patient or a person.
- A Near Miss is a situation that has the potential to cause harm to person(s) or property but does not, thanks to good timing or other fortunate happenstance.
- A **Sentinel Event** is a patient safety event that reaches a patient and results in death, permanent harm, or severe temporary harm. These events are called "sentinel" events because they signal the need for prompt investigation and response.

A Successful Magnet® Visit

WakeMed nurses are celebrating a successful, fourday, rigorous visit with ANCC Magnet appraisers October 12-15. Appraisers virtually visited all hospital-based units, practices and services. This was a re-designation visit. WakeMed first achieved ANCC Magnet Recognition in 2015. There are currently 540 Magnet-designated health care organizations in the world.



Expanded DVT Testing Now Available

WakeMed recently began offering three new imaging exams that provide faster turnaround times for suspected lower extremity DVT patients. These exams are available at all WakeMed Emergency Departments and hospitals, 24/7, and return results within one hour of the exam being performed. The new exams are:

- US Venous Doppler Left Lower STAT
- US Venous Doppler Right Lower STAT
- US Venous Doppler Bilateral Lower STAT

This new process will help ensure patients receive timely care, closer to home, and reduce the need for unnecessary transports or return visits. Hospital inpatients will also receive faster results when there is a suspected clot, leading to more efficient and effective interventions and expedited discharges.



WHAT'S NEW & NEXT WITH MYCHART

WakeMed MyChart has always been a useful tool for our patients – and this year has shown just how invaluable this portal really is! We have made a number of important changes to MyChart this year – including expanding access to virtual visits and eCheck-in and making it easier for patients to access emergency care. Here are a few recent and upcoming updates related to MyChart – all of which add additional value to patients by keeping them engaged in their care:

Open Notes Now Live

In September, WakeMed went live with Open Notes, which automatically releases clinical notes into MyChart once they are signed. Open Notes offers many benefits for patients and we are legally required to provide full patient access to this information under the Cures Act. Our ambulatory sites implemented Open Notes for physician documentation this spring, and now we are live across the system for all clinical notes (including nursing, therapy and more).

With Open Notes, patients are able to access medical documentation for inpatient and outpatient visits in MyChart as soon as notes are completed and signed (with very limited exceptions). Of course, patients have always had the right to access virtually everything in their medical record upon request – Open Notes just makes it available in MyChart or on the Bedside tablet automatically.

MyChart Upgrade Coming Soon

WakeMed MyChart will be getting a whole new look and feel as part of an Epic upgrade in December. The images above show a sneak peek. The goal of this update is to make it easier for patients to find what they are looking for and access the most relevant information for their health needs. Some features to look for include:

- Easy access shortcuts to common activities, such as appointments, medications and test results.
- A redesigned menu with consistent navigation across mobile and web.
- A health feed that guides patients to actions that are important to their care, like eCheck-in for an upcoming appointment or reading a new message. The health feed will also include information for all patients that the user has proxy access for.

Additionally, this upgrade will improve consistency between the MyChart website and mobile app – all features will be available on both platforms.

Reaching New Heights with MyChart!

This year we had a very ambitious goal of achieving a 40 percent MyChart activation rate across the WakeMed system. We are pleased to share that we beat that goal, ending the fiscal year with an overall activation rate of 41.7 percent! And, the overall MyChart activation rate for September was an incredible 45.1 percent – which means that nearly half of all patients seen at WakeMed in September were active MyChart users. Kudos to everyone who is working to make MyChart more useful for our patients and to everyone who encourages them to sign up and take advantage of this tool!



Communicating for Comfort

Our Environmental Services team plays an important role in making sure that our patients and families have a positive experience at WakeMed. Not only do they have the important job of helping ensure a clean environment for patients and visitors, cleanliness is a topic on the HCAHPS survey that we use to evaluate the overall patient experience. To help support this goal, nearly 300 EVS staff members recently participated in training that supports our Wake Way Every-Time behaviors of Communication and Respect for People.

The training equipped our EVS teams with useful tools to ensure that our patients and families have clear understanding of what is happening around them, and why. Staff learned about the "AIDET Plus the Promise" communication framework as well as the concept of "Managing Up" to instill trust and confidence.

"This was a great opportunity for our team to learn about AIDET and how it can help reduce patient anxiety. Staff really embraced the framework as a way to engage with patients, share a bit about themselves and put our patients at ease," commented **Coleen Athey**, director (EVS – Raleigh Campus).

"Clear communication enhances quality and safety. It's so important to help patients understand the 'why' behind the actions we are taking. A good example is explaining that we close curtains for privacy and not because we don't want to see you," added **Dianna Knight**, RN, executive director, Patient & Family Experience.

To ensure the new tools become part of standard work, EVS will be conducting AIDET observation coaching sessions with staff and incorporate AIDET reminder moments into huddles and staff meetings. **Maria Tolano**, supervisor, (EVS) and **Rhonda Long**, manager (Guest Services – North Hospital) will also team up to offer the training to new employees and anyone who was unable to attend the initial sessions.

Remember AIDET for Good Communication

When the Wake Way Every-Time Behaviors were introduced in 2016, we implemented AIDET to help foster good communication. It's a powerful tool that can be used in any situation and gives you a context to work from when talking with anyone who is nervous, anxious or feeling vulnerable. It can also be used as we communicate with our colleagues, especially when we are providing an internal service.

- Acknowledge others with a smile or greeting
- Introduce yourself using your name, role and background
- Provide an estimate of the **duration** of time might be needed for the given experience
- Give an **explanation** of what you are doing, how it works and how it will impact the person
- Conclude every interaction with a sincere "Thank You"



TELESTROKE & TELENEUROLOGY COMING SOON

Faster, More Comprehensive Care for Stroke & General Neurology Patients

WakeMed is pleased to announce the introduction of two new neurological services aimed at helping our patients get access to the stroke and general neurology care they need as quickly as possible – while staying close to home. These services are part of strategic collaborative efforts involving our neurology partners to enhance our current range of neuroscience capabilities as part of our Brain & Spine Health program.

First, a new telestroke program will provide patients at any of our Emergency Departments with 24/7 access to neurological evaluation and consultation within 10 minutes of their arrival. Stroke patients will undergo a virtual neurological evaluation that offers essentially the same assessment capabilities as a face-to-face evaluation. Implementing this service system-wide will help with the clinical decision-making needed to get stroke patients the interventions they need as quickly as possible.

Additionally, a new teleneurology program allows three fellowship-trained vascular neurologists to virtually consult and round daily on North Hospital patients with any general neurological problems – ranging from headaches to dementia to meningitis. This allows our hospitalist and *e*ICU physicians to partner with highly trained experts in neurology for real-time evaluation and consultation. With the addition of these programs,

patients across the system will now have access to electroencephalogram

(EEG) testing. An

EEG is one of several tests used to monitor the brain activity following any changes in neurological status. When it comes to stroke, time is brain, so this ability to speed up evaluation and diagnosis means stroke patients will inevitably have better outcomes.

"A key strategy of our Brain & Spine Health program is to enhance our non-traditional partnerships through the institution of a system-wide, comprehensive care delivery framework. Adding these comprehensive neurology services across our continuum of care is just one way we are growing to meet the needs of our community," commented Larissa Hill, executive director (Neurosciences).

We will share additional updates in the coming months about service and program enhancements related to our Brain & Spine Health Center of Excellence.




