

The Ladder stitch is a great way to hide your stitches when closing your huggables and burp cloths! It is so easy! First, hide your knot by sending your needle inside of the huggable and bringing it through the fabric a few stitches before the opening. Next align your edges and run steps two and three, continue pulling closed as you go along to the end. About 1/8th of an inch between each stitch. Knot off your thread by making another stitch opposite of where the edge emerges and send the needle through the fabric, double up for extra strength. Trim.






This sweet Children's ED patient was so excited to receive a comforting huggable and a warm blanket while she waited for treatment.
