I would not be who I am today or where I am without him. I enjoy bowling, going to the movies, and the time to have down time to relax and unwind and look at life in different ways and have reflection. Making a difference in a person's life; it is the small things in life that make a difference and leave the impact on someone. Doing something for someone such as buying them a meal or whatever out of the kindness of your heart as a kind gesture and paying it forward. Dear Tiffany,

I just wanted to express my appreciation for the volunteers that sew the little animal pillows available for our patients in the Ronald McDonald House at WakeMed. Not only do they bring our pediatric patients comfort, we are able to use them in physical therapy to encourage weight bearing, by having a soft surface for the patient to attempt to put their foot down when they are painful and fearful (for example after having an infected hip or leg joint). Often this quickly translates into being able to bear weight on their foot to progress to walking and the pillow becomes a helpful step in between. My 4 year old patient yesterday used the little green dinosaur for this and was motivated to rest his foot on the dinosaur and progressed to walking and bearing weight. He loves the dinosaur, even exclaiming, "how cute!"
