WakeMed Opens First Dedicated, **Outpatient Cardiac CT Scanner**



This summer, WakeMed will open its first dedicated outpatient cardiac CT scanner at Raleigh Medical Park. Cardiac CT is a tool for the diagnosis of coronary artery disease (CAD), particularly in patients experiencing chest pain. The test, known as coronary computed tomography angiography (CCTA), offers several significant advantages over stress testing, which has commonly been used for the past three decades.

"WakeMed is ahead of the curve for the advanced evaluation of chest pain and diagnosis of CAD," explains Douglas Friedman, MD (Heart & Vascular). "We know that coronary CT is emerging as the preferred method of assessing a patient with chest pain, and will allow us to ensure patients receive the right treatment, while avoiding unnecessary invasive procedures."

While WakeMed has offered Cardiac CT services for several years, this new machine marks the first time we have a dedicated Cardiac CT scanner. Some of the benefits that this new Cardiac CT will offer include:

- > A detailed 3D image of the arteries around the heart
- > Enhanced detail on the location and extent of the blockages
- > Ability to identify significant blockages that could be missed with a

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> A noninvasive option – unlike cardiac catheterization, which is often performed when a stress test isn't definitive

Recipients must have three or more years of clinical experience and exhibit leadership in establishing, maintaining and supporting clinical teaching programs at WakeMed.

DRESS THE PART

& SHOW YOUR WAKEMED PRIDE!

As members of the WakeMed family, we are all ambassadors of the WakeMed culture and mission. First impressions are important, and our appearance and dress help set the stage for interactions with patients, family members and visitors. That's why it's important to represent WakeMed well by maintaining a professional appearance that aligns with our dress code.

The Wake Way policy sets standards for all employees to follow while allowing flexibility to express your personal style in a way that's appropriate for your role – whether that's clinical, administrative or support.

When it comes to dressing for success at WakeMed, be sure to follow these guidelines:

- > Scrubs: In areas where scrub uniforms are worn, consistency is key. Scrub tops must be solid red, black or gray or a printed combination of only red, black, gray, and/or white. Scrub bottoms must be solid red, black or gray. *Please note* that maroon, burgundy, pink, salmon and purple scrubs are not permitted. Unfortunately, an increase in these other colors has been observed lately.
 - > Staff who work in pediatric areas may wear printed tops with cartoons or other kid-oriented designs/patterns but they must still be a combination of red, black, gray and/or white.
- > Green procedural scrubs are permitted only in those areas where they are required to be worn and are provided by the organization. These scrubs may not be worn outside of WakeMed buildings.
- > T-shirts: T-shirts, including WakeMed t-shirts, are not allowed except on designated Spirit Days or for an approved WakeMed event. On Spirit Days (every Friday and the 1st and 15th of every month), staff are welcome to showcase their WakeMed pride by wearing a branded t-shirt or polo shirt. Spirit day shirts must be in WakeMed colors and have the approved WakeMed logo. Departments may purchase t-shirts with the WakeMed logo and department name on them however, no other



imagery or wording is permitted. Remember, all public-facing uses of the WakeMed logo must be approved by Marketing & Communications.

- **Sneakers:** Clean athletic shoes are permitted for appropriate roles particularly those areas where staff are on their feet all day. Staff working in administrative roles are permitted to wear dress/fashion sneakers, but not athletic shoes. Dress sneakers are typically softsoled but have the look of a dress shoe on the top of the shoe. If you are unsure what qualifies as a dress sneaker, speak with your manager.
- Blue Denim: In general, blue denim is not permitted. Managers of departments not located at a patient care site may designate days when jeans can be worn if there is no patient/visitor contact.

The WakeMed Clinical Research Institute (CRI) and the WakeMed Foundation are pleased to announce the 2025 recipients of the WakeMed Foundation Clinical Investigator Award: Aman Luther, MD (Wake Orthopaedics), Leigh Chancey, PhD (Mental Health & Well-Being); and Osi Udekwu, MD (General Surgery & Trauma).

The goal of this grant award is to support investigator-initiated research at WakeMed by providing up to \$10,000 to be used for scientifically-sound research projects that align with the mission of the CRI.

Dr. Luther's project will be funded to explore the implementation of a 2D camera, markerless-based system with convolutional neural networks for hand and upper extremity recovery. Support will be provided for Dr. Chancey's project as she continues her work on cognitive behavioral therapy for pediatric disorders of gut-brain interaction. Dr. Udekwu's project will focus on an 11-year update exploring outcomes in blunt chest injury management with early institution of non-invasive bi-level positive airway pressure ventilation, BIPAP, compared to invasive approaches.

"The Clinical Research Institute has significant infrastructure to support industry-sponsored research, but we also wish to support and encourage original research at WakeMed – led by our own WakeMed team. Thanks to the generosity of the WakeMed Foundation, we are able to fill a gap and offer new ways to fund this work," commented **Bill Lagarde**, MD, Medical Director (Clinical Research Institute).

CARY HOSPITAL MAINTAINS FIVE STAR CMS RATING

Each year the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) publishes star ratings for over 4,000 Medicare-certified hospitals in the country. The ratings reflect the quality of care and patient experience and are intended to help consumers make informed choices about where to obtain health care.

We are pleased to share that Cary Hospital once again received an overall rating of five stars – the highest number available! Raleigh Campus (which includes North Hospital) once again received four stars. The overall star rating is based on how well a hospital performs across different areas of quality, such as treating heart attacks and pneumonia, readmission rates and safety of care.

CMS also gives stars based on patient survey ratings, and all WakeMed facilities received four stars this year. The patient survey rating measures patients' experiences of their hospital care, including how well nurses and doctors communicated, how responsive hospital staff were to their needs, and the cleanliness and quietness of the hospital.

CLINICAL RESEARCH UPDATE

TiGER Trial Evaluates New Device for the Treatment of Aortic Aneurysm

The TiGER (Terumo Aortic Global Endovascular Registry) study is an observational study evaluating patients who have been treated with the Terumo Aortic RelayPro device for surgical repair or correction of the thoracic aorta. This new device is a thoracic graft stent system used in surgeries that treat aortic aneurysm, dissection, or transection. The device provides an alternative conduit for blood flow, which can prevent further aneurysm growth, rupture, and death. This study is led by Christopher McQuinn, MD, (Heart & Vascular) with his surgical colleagues as sub-investigators. Patients will be followed to collect a broad range of clinical data to support the safety and performance of the device.

Wake AHEC recently received Accreditation with Commendation from the Southern States CME Collaborative (SSCC) Accreditation Review Committee (ARC). The new accreditation term will expire on June 20, 2031. Wake AHEC was found to be in compliance with all core accreditation criteria, standards for Integrity and Independence of Accredited CE, and SSCC policies.
